The Kenan Chapel Music Committee chaired by Reuben Allen is dedicated to bringing exemplary talent and concerts to the community. The Music Committee is comprised of persons who help make this a reality. Our concerts perform to a full house with standing ovations at the conclusion of the concert. Not only are the concerts free but a reception is provided after most of them at The Country Club of Landfall.

We began 2016 with a Chamber Music Concert. The Tallis Chamber Orchestra returned for our annual Mothers' Day Concert. This is the eighth year The Port City Music Festival has begun its concert series at the Chapel. The Wilmington Girls Choir delivered a beautiful program in April. Peter Borgia gave us a piano concert in September. David Heinzman provided an organ concert in October; he also gave a wonderful tutorial about our organ.

The North Carolina School of the Arts rewarded us with three outstanding concerts in 2016. The first was a flute partners' concert

in March followed by a piano collaborative in April. In November, the Fletcher Opera performed operatic pieces and treated us to popular music at the reception. In December, we will have our second annual Christmas Caroling at the Chapel, initiated and arranged by Dennis and Melissa Danelowski.

The Tallis Chamber Orchestra and The Port City Music Festival will return in 2017 as well as UNC School of the Arts students and UNCW students. We have many other great performances scheduled, providing a variety of entertainment including a Jazz Concert. Our goal is to bring emerging artists to our community, and we will continue on the same path in the future. We are very excited about our 2017 programs.

Concerts are held at 5:00 p.m. on a Sunday usually once a month; complimentary tickets are available at the NE branch of the Library on the Monday preceding the Sunday concert. If the Monday is a holiday, the tickets will be available on the following Tuesday.

Much has happened since March of 1996 when I met with Frank and Betty Kenan to discuss Mr. Kenan's desire to build an Interfaith Chapel for the Landfall community and greater Wilmington area. Unfortunately, Frank Kenan died three months later on June 4, 1996. Sometime after his death, Betty Kenan and the Kenan family decided to fulfill his wishes with construction of the Chapel in his honor.

A Board of Directors was elected to plan for and manage a newly formed nonprofit corporation. The Chapel would be used for weddings, memorial services, christenings, musical programs, special events, and individual meditation and prayer. A new site was selected, the Chapel built, and we received this gift to our community at a Dedication Service on August 5, 2001.

With four acres of property, we had the opportunity to have a Memorial Garden for Landfall residents. A Chapel Board of Directors' Resolution approved such, endorsed by the Kenan family. We dedicated the Original Memorial Garden on December 17, 2003. We added the Labyrinth, the Chapel Woods, and now the Jack and Ann



Leister Bridge. The Memorial Garden is a serene, tranquil, wooded area - a place to walk and meditate. A gift.

The Chapel is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., unless a service, wedding rehearsal, or program is being held.

Through the years the Chapel Board and Landfall residents have expanded on the gift. I encourage you and guests to visit our Chapel and walk through the Memorial Garden.

Exceptional Performances NORTH CAROLINA SCHOOL OF THE ARTS

The Kenan Chapel has a long-term relationship with the North Carolina School of the Arts in Winston-Salem. Every year the school brings several student groups to Wilmington to share their talent and creativity with us at the Kenan Chapel concerts.

These students are studying to be professional musicians and have bright futures ahead of them, after completing their studies. Their concerts are always well received.

The University of North Carolina School of the Arts in Winston-Salem is one of 17 institutions in the North Carolina University system. It is a public coeducational arts conservatory that grants high school, undergraduate, and graduate degrees.

When it was founded in 1963, it was the first public arts conservatory in the United States. The school consists of 5 professional schools-Dance, Design and Production, Drama, Filmmaking, and Music.

UNCSA is an academic treasure in North Carolina. It starts with high school where students combine half their time in academics with conservatory training in the arts, which includes dance, visual arts, drama and music. The undergraduate program lets the students pursue their passions such as Design and Production, Dance, Film, Music



and Drama, while preparing them, realistically, for a professional career. The graduate program provides the students the opportunity to refine their craft with very exceptionally talented faculty mentors who help them become dynamic artists in the professional world.

This wonderful institution is also fortunate. Over the years, through the generosity of the Kenan Family, UNCSA has received extraordinary financial support to allow it to flourish and become world class.

As with all great organizations UNCSA seems to have a humility and sense of humor to go along with its outstanding reputation. What better way to show this than to look at a photo of its mascot, The Fighting Pickle?

Other always popular activities for children included pony rides, hayrides, and the Kids' Golf Chipping Clinic, organized by staff of CCL's Director of Golf Greg Guman.

All of these events were highlighted and narrated by the "Voice of Landfall" Monte Coughlin who emceed and kept Festival goers informed and excited about the action.

Food, as usual, was a major attraction. From the baked goods at the Great Oaks Club to the hamburgers and hot dogs grilled by CCL Chefs Tim and Chris to floats featuring Boombalatti's ice cream to the "Spooky Meals" for kids, no one went home hungry.
