From The Music Committee

The Kenan Chapel Music Committee is dedicated to bringing outstanding talent to the Kenan Chapel throughout the year with its beautiful concerts. The committee meets periodically to decide on a variety of programs, many stressing young, emerging artists and the free concerts are often followed by a reception in the Country Club of Landfall.

From the North Carolina School of the Arts in Winston-Salem, there were three concerts. The Chapel is very fortunate to have music from the school which is part of the University of North Carolina. In February, Faculty Members Allison Gagnon, pianist, and Ida Bieler, violinist, played to a very enthusiastic crowd, using the lovely grand piano, a gift from Annice Hawkins Kenan Smith, Frank Kenan's daughter.

The March concert was also from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts, and three very talented young people presented a second program again using the piano from the Kenans.

The third in the series of concerts from the School of the Arts was the Chrysalis Wind Quintet. Highlighting the special acoustics in the Chapel made this a particularly nice program.

Mothers' Day brings the Tallis Chamber Orchestra to Wilmington each year. Their concert is always very popular with our Landfall audience.

2019 was the 11th year of the Port City Music Festival, and, as in the past, the inaugural concert was held in the Kenan Chapel, followed by a reception in the Landfall Club.The Kenan Chapel and the Port City Music Festival plan to further explore the possibilities regarding the Emerging Artist Program with the Port City Music Festival.

On September 29, Lilac 94 performed a program composed of several pieces that were commissioned by the harp duo. Christina Brier and Kathryn Sloat have given international concerts with their two harps, and the Kenan Chapel was fortunate to have them in Wilmington.

To round out the year's programs were two concerts featuring emerging artists. On October 27, the Kenan Music Scholars came to town bringing about 20 of their outstanding music scholars from Chapel Hill. The concert featured wind players, string players, pianists, and vocalists. They presented a concert with solos and small group chamber music, including classical standards, jazz, and original compositions. The Kenan Scholars are favorites in our Chapel.

The November program, entitled Winners, included four young people who were winners from two different competitions. The Wilmington Symphony winners were Tanya Hanano, mezzo soprano UNCW winner, and Douglas Han, pianist, the middle school winner. The Brooklyn Arts Music Academy Bach Double competition winners were Isabella Garcia and Joshua Gibbs, both violinists. The program featuring these four winning musicians was very special.

Plans for concerts in 2020 will continue to feature more outstanding musicians in our lovely Kenan Chapel.

18TH ANNUAL FALL FESTIVAL

Since early Spring of this year, Fall Festival event chair Mike Kane and his trusted team of volunteer coordinators planned and implemented the largest Landfall Fall Festival to date. With the event cancellation last year because of the hurricane recovery efforts, Mike and numerous eager volunteers meticulously mapped out the best Fall Festival in Landfall with activities for all ages. Near the park's entrance, attendees were greeted by volunteers of the Great Oaks Club who hosted a bake sale with a large selection of baked goods to enjoy on site or at home. A robust silent auction lead by Kathy Sartarelli and John Ballance gave folks a chance to bid on items donated primarily by Landfallbased businesses. Our annual 50/50 raffle prize winner won \$1,078.

The Car Show "steered" by Van Hemphill and Phil Rodilosso boasted over 25 entries of every conceivable vintage. The children's games were reimagined and upgraded to the delight of many children. The crowd favorite was the cucumber squash races with wheels donated by the Boy Scouts of America and an anonymous Landfall resident. Numerous vendors lined the recreation site with flowers, decorated pumpkins and mums for sale. The Children's Museum, Keep New Hanover Beautiful, and Wilmington Compost

Company offered information centers to help spread the word and good works of their agencies. A crowd and children's favorite was the interactive exhibit from "We Use Worms" which introduced Landfall residents to the uses of vermiculture. TamaTea, The Donut Inn, Kale Me Crazy and Nothing Bundt Cakes offered festival-goers samples of their delicious goods.


